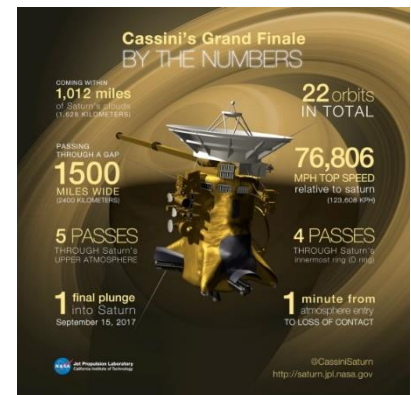

## Game Review - Forza Horizon 3

Forza, the name itself suggests something fast and adventurous, doesn't it? Forza Horizon 3 is an open world racing game, developed by Playground Games, and published by one of the most well-known companies, Microsoft. It is available on the famous Xbox One and Microsoft Windows 10 (may support previous version, depending on computer specs). This does support multi player too, and you get the best experience when you play it on Xbox One as the game supports vibration on the controller, which really gives a realistic driving experience. Because, from every jump to every drift, your controller vibrates, and has very good synchronization with the graphics, too. It does provide a very good quality of graphics and doesn't lag anywhere, but all this would depend on your computer or your TV in case of Xbox. Drifting isn't hard at all; you can easily drift with ease with



just a press of a single button. The map uses places in Australia, simultaneously providing a very well designed roads, with very realistic buildings and surroundings. This game includes various events including time trails, Bucket list challenges, etc... Bucket list challenges basically provide you with a car and a particular challenge, which you have to complete. This game has a total of 350 cars available (the number keeps increasing with newer updates). Extra car packs can always be downloaded if you wish to increase the fun. It also allows the gamer to customize the car – from painting, to engine upgrade, to transmission and much more endless opportunities to make it completely yours! Speaking of racing and terrain, it is a perfect combination of both; you can race through roads, streets, mountains or even through sand dunes and beaches. When it comes to a realistic experience, the only drawback is that the game allows you to drive on water, but on the other hand some gamers would actually like it, so that is based on you. Based on the users' view, this game is very highly rated. It got a 9.5/10 in IGN.com and a 10/10 in TrustedReviews, one of the most famous gaming sites. Forza also provides a similar series known as Forza Motorsport, with a few minor differences. In my opinion, I would conclude this as one of the best all terrain racing games I have ever played, so don't forget to try it out!

## Exam Tips

**M**ost of us have trouble planning out a study schedule or deciding which subject to study or where to study... – in short, we have trouble revising for our exams. With the exams just around the corner, I thought it would be helpful to list out a few important tips that are sure to give great results.

Here's the first one: Make a revision timetable. Now, this may be a very common tip, but regardless, it is definitely the most important and most effective. Remember, it's never too late to start revising, and it always help to plan out your revision time and stay organized even if you only have an hour to revise.

Second: Take breaks. Studying for as long as even 8 hours at a stretch is useless compared to studying for half that time with breaks in between, just long enough for your brain to sit back and relax a little. The best way to organize your study is to study for 30 minutes, take a 5-minute break, study for another half-hour, take a 5-minute break, study for 30 minutes again, after which you can give yourself a longer break for around 20 minutes as a reward.

Third: Give yourself rewards. It always helps to set a goal and reward yourself once you've achieved it. It could be a movie after intensive study, a long walk with your dog, some time to continue the novel you had been reading – anything at all. But one mistake most of us do is that we sometimes tend to concentrate more on the reward than our revision. Make sure to focus all your attention on studying and not on the reward at the end, otherwise all that time you spend revising will just be rendered useless.

Fourth: Study someplace where you can remain uninterrupted for a long time. It takes time to train your concentration to remain on your books and once it strays, it becomes harder to do the same once again.

Fifth and the last tip: Rest. It is very important to be completely rested before you study. Your brain can't handle all those revision notes if it's weary and tired; it needs to be fresh and ready to absorb all that information. So make sure you never miss out on your sleep. Trust me, the time you spend resting is time well spent.

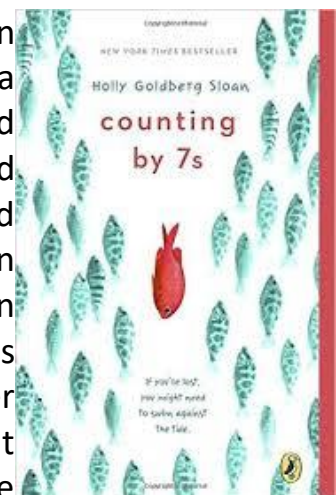

### Book Review - Counting By 7s

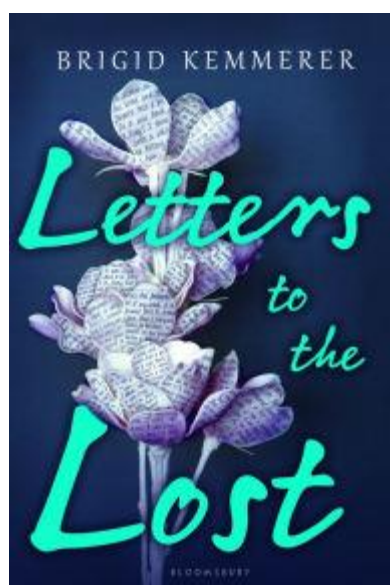

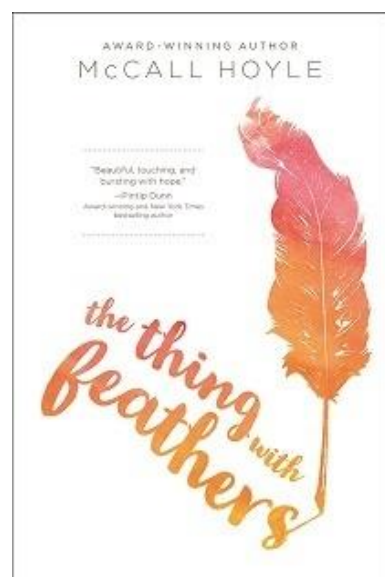

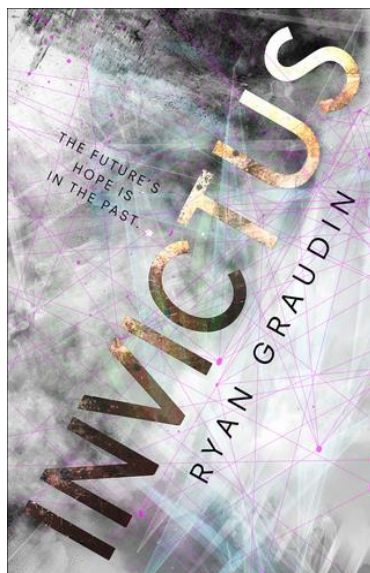

With time, the partners get closer to each other but alas her always persistent fear on her newly adjusted epilepsy meds' failure.

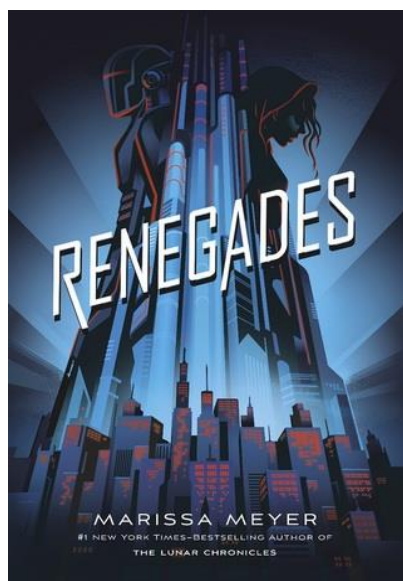
Now a huge decision rests on Emilie's hands- will she hide away as per order or will she overcome her condition by living through it?

After flunking his final time traveling test, he follows his fetish to experience history through the secretive doors of the black market along with a fair entourage guided by the name of searching for valuables in history.

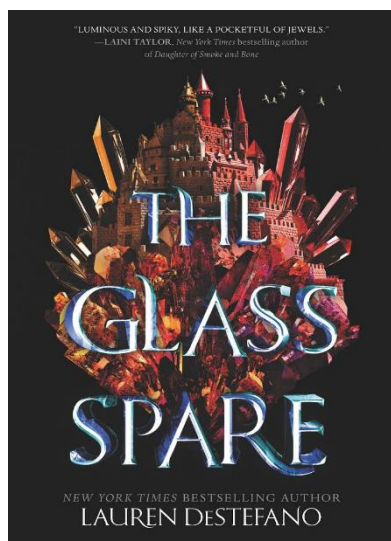

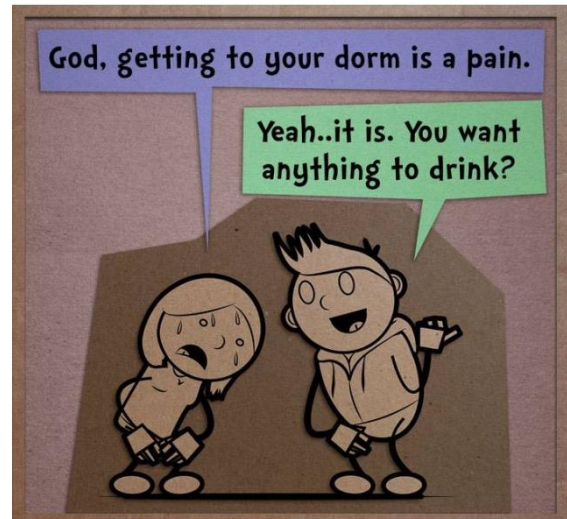

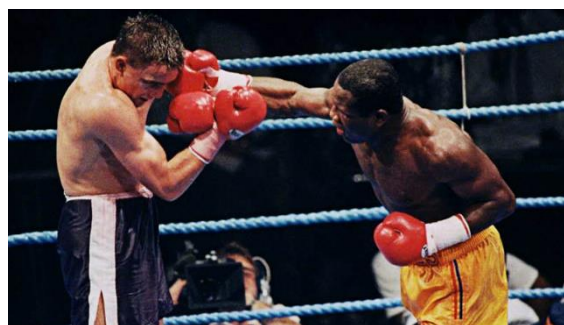
### AGUERO'S GOAL TO REMEMBER
