


Pocket Phonics

Early phonics knowledge is the key to starting to decode written words. Children can use phonics knowledge to "sound out" words. Phonics is essential for children to become successful readers and spellers/writers in the early years of schooling and beyond. Phonics education is one method that can be incorporated into a complete, well-rounded reading program that encourages visual learners to recognize whole words by sight, and creates opportunities for extensive reading and creative writing. Our tiny tots exhibited their understanding of open vowel through illustration, writing words and framing sentences.



Our little champs are able to recognize and pronounce consonant digraphs sh, ch, ck, ng, th and wh. They are able to read and spell simple words with consonant digraph spelling patterns in initial, medial, and final positions. Our tiny tots are showing great interest in reading story books. Kudos to the young learners!!!




