

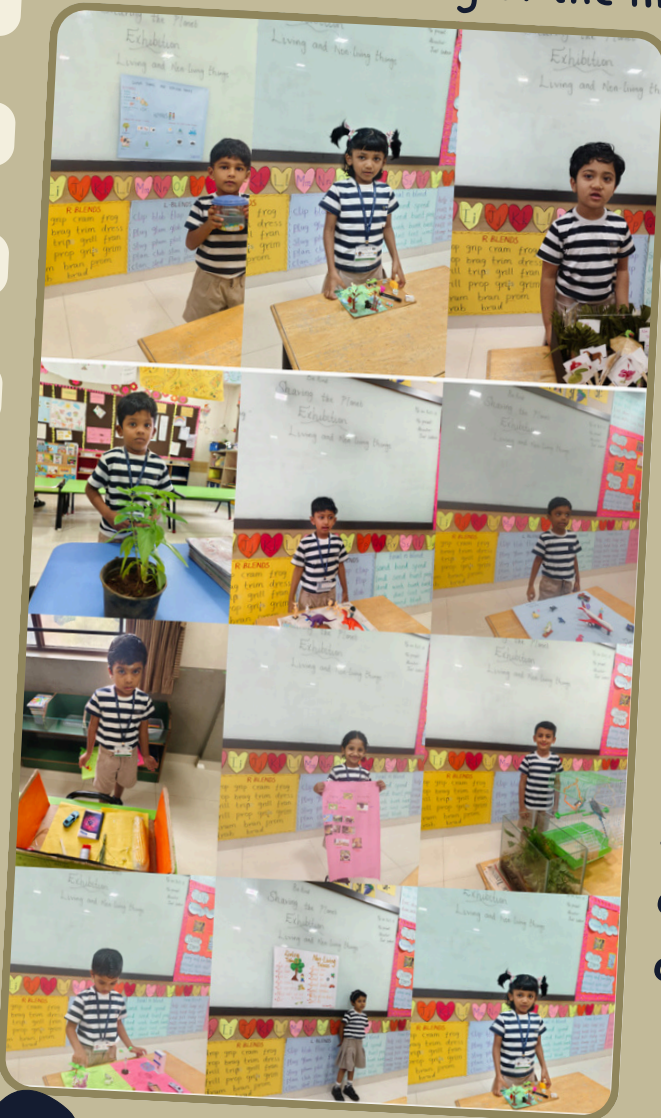

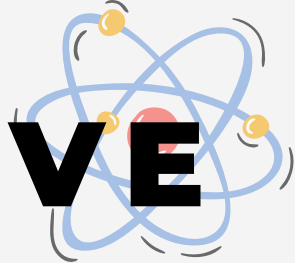

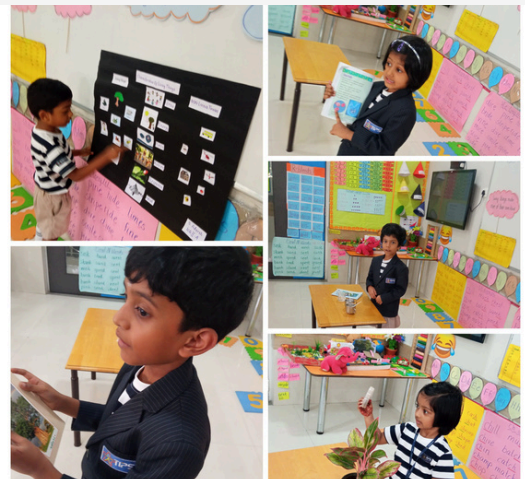

# LEARNING CURVE

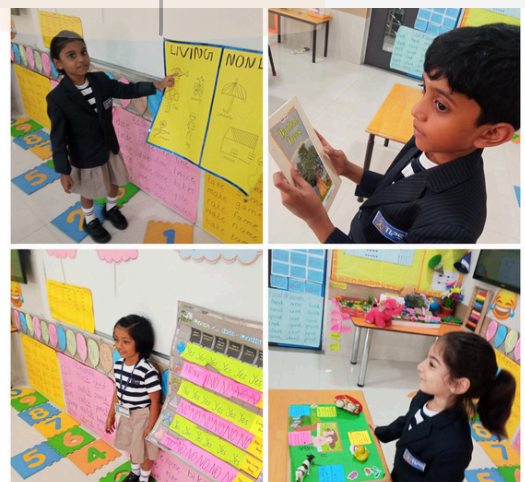


As our inquiry into living and non-living things, under the theme Sharing the Planet, came to a close, our young explorers reflected on their understanding of the central idea through various forms of expression, such as models, artwork, and more, during the exhibition strategy.



During the second Student-Led Conference, they selected a concept they wished to focus on and used appropriate materials to present their ideas. Some students used models to illustrate how living things differ from non-living things based on the six rules, while others displayed artwork to show how living things rely on both other living and non-living things for their survival.

A few chose books such as Amazing Cells, Baobab Trees, and Babies and Parents, using them to explain the contents to the audience. This gave our learners an opportunity to demonstrate their understanding of the unit while building their confidence and communication skills.

The Student-Led Conference for kindergarten was successful! Parents were thrilled to see their young ones take charge and showcase their learning.



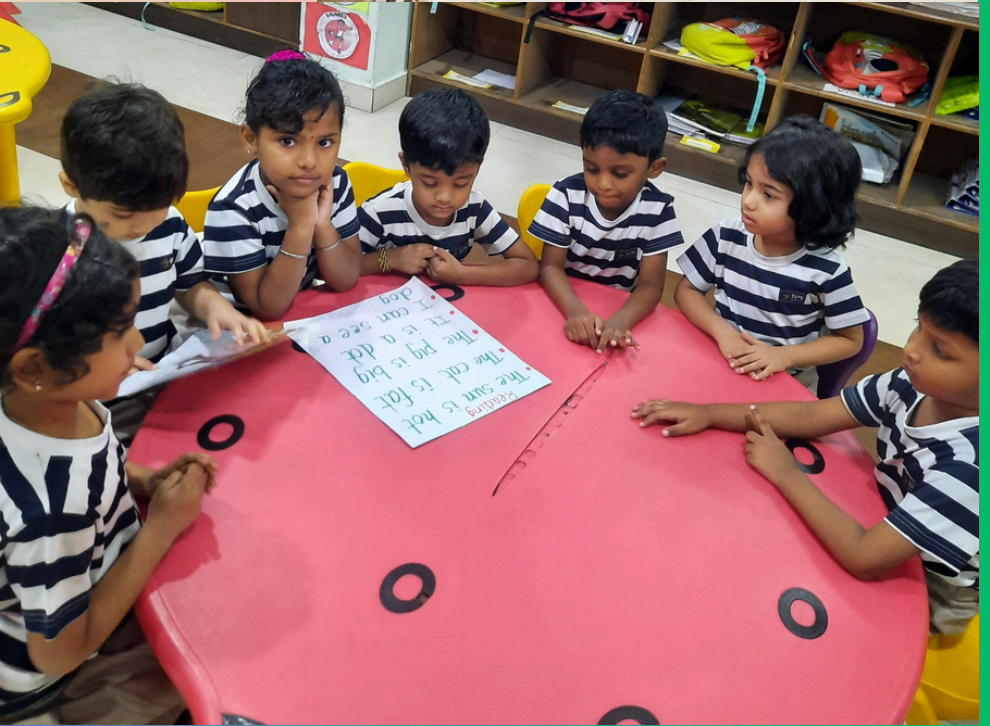

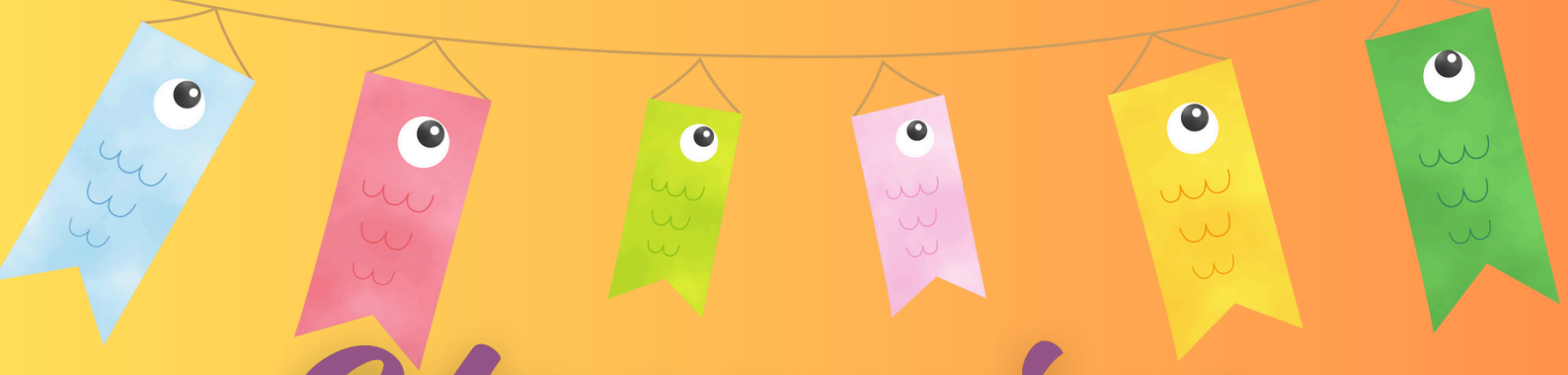
